 - ✓ Research the best times to visit for optimal wildlife viewing and trail conditions

- DID YOU KNOW?**
- Ngezi Forest Reserve is one of the last refuges for the Pemba flying fox, a large fruit bat species unique to the island and critically endangered.
 - The forest is home to ancient and towering trees, some of which are centuries old, providing a glimpse into the region's prehistoric flora.
 - The reserve boasts several bird species found only in Pemba, including the Pemba white-eye and the Pemba vanga, making it a prime destination for birdwatchers.
