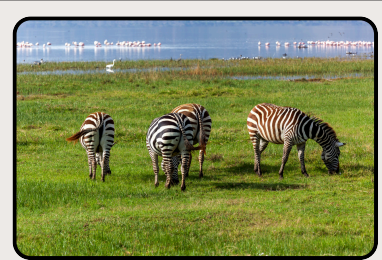

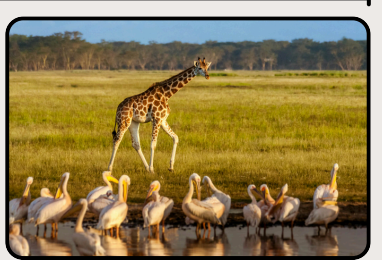

- Lake Nakuru is renowned for its huge flocks of lesser flamingos, which can sometimes number in the hundreds of thousands, creating a spectacular pink spectacle on the lake.
 - The park is one of Kenya's key sanctuaries for rhinos, particularly the critically endangered black rhino, offering excellent chances to see these majestic creatures.
 - The lake is part of the East African Rift System and is surrounded by ancient volcanic formations and lava flows, adding to its dramatic scenery.
