DID YOU KNOW?

- The Serengeti is renowned for the Great Migration, where over 1.5 million wildebeest, along with thousands of zebras and gazelles, migrate in a circular route through Tanzania and Kenya.
- The park features varied landscapes like savannahs, woodlands, and grasslands, supporting a rich array of wildlife.
- The park is close to the Olduvai Gorge, a significant archaeological site often referred to as the "Cradle of Mankind." It has yielded some of the oldest human fossils and stone tools, offering insights into early human evolution and prehistory.
