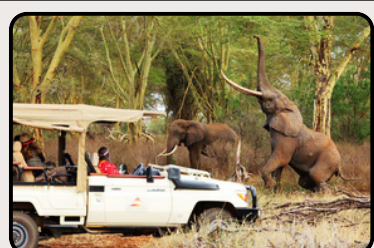
Tsavo East and Tsavo West National Parks, located in southeastern Kenya, form one of the largest and most diverse wildlife conservation areas in Africa. Tsavo East is known for its vast, open savannahs, dramatic red soils, and the iconic Yatta Plateau, providing expansive vistas and abundant wildlife, including large herds of elephants and various antelope species. Tsavo West, in contrast, features more varied landscapes, including rugged mountains, volcanic hills, and lush riverine forests. Notable attractions include the Mzima Springs, a freshwater oasis home to hippos and crocodiles, and the Shetani Lava Flow, a striking volcanic formation. Together, these parks offer a rich tapestry of habitats and wildlife, ensuring a dynamic and captivating safari experience with opportunities to explore both classic savannahs and unique geological features.

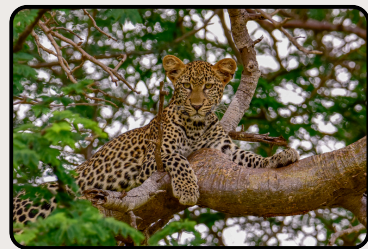

- Bring lightweight, breathable clothing, and layers for cooler evenings
 - consider bringing a dust mask or scarf
 - Maintain a safe distance from animals and follow park guidelines to avoid disturbing them
 - Include insect repellent and a flashlight for evening activities
 - Enhance your wildlife viewing with binoculars

- DID YOU KNOW?**
- Tsavo East is renowned for its "red" elephants, whose distinctive reddish hue comes from rolling in the park's red dust.
 - Tsavo West's Mzima Springs are fed by underground rivers from Mount Kilimanjaro, creating lush oases and clear pools that are a vital habitat for hippos and other wildlife.
 - The parks are famous for the Man-Eaters of Tsavo, a pair of maneless lions that terrorized railway workers in the early 1900s and now feature in the Field Museum of Natural History in Chicago.
