- Hagia Sophia's dome was an engineering marvel of its time, standing as the **largest cathedral dome** for nearly a thousand years until the Renaissance. Its innovative design inspired later Byzantine and Ottoman architecture.
- Originally a Christian cathedral, it was converted into a mosque in 1453 and later became a museum in 1935, reflecting its diverse cultural history.
- Islamic calligraphy inside Hagia Sophia blends with Christian mosaics, showcasing a unique fusion of cultures and religions over time.
