- Choose lightweight, neutral-colored clothing
 - Bring plenty of water, as the climate can be quite hot
 - Keep a safe distance from animals and follow guide instructions to avoid disturbing them
 - Be mindful of local traditions and practices when interacting with the Samburu people
 - Bring a dust mask or scarf, as the terrain can be very dusty

- Samburu is home to the rare "Samburu Five": Grevy's zebra, reticulated giraffe, Somali ostrich, gerenuk, and Beisa oryx.
- The reserve features volcanic landscapes like the Kalama Mountains, adding to its stunning scenery.
- The Samburu people, who live in and around the reserve, are closely related to the Maasai but have their own distinct customs and traditions. They are known for their colorful beadwork and intricate body adornments, which are a vibrant part of the cultural experience when visiting the reserve.
